She said completing Kumon Mathematics provided a foundation for solving some scientific calculations, and Kumon English will support her in report writing.



"[At the same time], we thought that enrolling in Kumon English would also be beneficial for Michelle, both now and in the future."


We wish Michelle all the best with her future veterinary career.
